It includes anticipated contract opportunities greater than \$150,000 that small businesses may be able to perform either through direct contracts with Treasury Department bureaus or through subcontract arrangements with large prime contractors.

## Expanding Diversity in OCC Business Activities


The Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC) created the Office of Minority and Women Inclusion (OMWI) in January 2011 to meet the goals established in the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010. The OMWI Executive Director and Diversity and Inclusion Team are responsible for developing standards for

- equal employment opportunity and the racial, ethnic, and gender diversity of the OCC's workforce and senior management;
- increased participation of minority-owned and women-owned businesses in the OCC's programs and contracts, including standards for coordinating technical assistance to such businesses; and
- assessing the diversity policies and practices of entities regulated by the OCC.

## Supplier Diversity

The OCC engages in approximately \$118 million in annual procurement actions representing about 1,400 actions. The OCC is committed to ensuring increased participation of minority- and women-owned businesses in the OCC's contracts and providing technical assistance and outreach to such businesses.

The OCC's procurement efforts include a commitment to awarding contracts to small businesses; firms owned by women, minorities, veterans, and service-disabled veterans; and concerns located in HUBZones. The OCC works with the U.S. Department of the Treasury and the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) to achieve established small-business goals.

## Office of the Comptroller of the Currency

The OCC's primary mission is to charter, regulate, and supervise national banks and federal savings associations. Its goal is to ensure these financial institutions operate in a safe and sound manner and in compliance with laws requiring the fair treatment of customers and fair access to credit and financial products.

The agency was established in 1863 as an independent bureau of the U.S. Department of the Treasury. Headquartered in Washington, D.C., the OCC has district offices in New York, Chicago, Dallas, and Denver as well as 67 field offices throughout the country and an office in London. The OCC employs approximately 4,000 full-time staff members.
